

In the last 2 weeks, the TCBA lost 2 long-time members to Covid-19. In the words of Patty Mead, "Clayton and Bev volunteered as SAG drivers and other functions in the club. Clayton Townsend, age 92, passed away October 23, 2020. He was born September 7, 1928, to Virgil and Lowine Townsend. Clayton was active in the Michigan National Guard for 35 years, achieving the rank of Master Sergeant. He worked for over 40 years at GM, retiring as a supervisor. He was a member of the Bath Lions Club and rode with the Tri-County Bicycle Association for over 30 years. One of his proudest achievements was bicycling across the country, starting in Portland, Oregon and ending in Bay Harbor, Maine.

"There's a common misconception that you only need lights when it's dark or getting dark. Due to almost getting hit in the middle of the day by a driver, whom I believe simply didn't see me in the dark shadows of a tree (some people's eyes don't adjust very quickly to extreme lighting changes), I have since strongly encouraged people to use flashing lights, front and rear, whenever they ride and not just when it's getting dark."

That's how Tim Potter starts an excellent blog post, including some significant research data, on the importance of being seen while riding. As the weather continues to treat us to some extra days for fall cycling, let's remember to be safe while out on the road. And sure, Tim runs a bike shop, but as he reminded me, he tries to keep his blog focused on helping people enjoy their rides while being safe.

Documenting a ride along the Berlin Wall

One of the articles that caught my attention this past month, was an article about Rob Dawson, a New Zealander filmmaker and cyclist, who after hearing Christopher Bennett's story about the 1240 km (770 mi) ride that follows the Berlin Wall, was so inspired by it that is now working on a documentary project inspired by his trip. The original story appeared in March this year (and it made it to US outlets in November!) in the New Zealand site Stuff (both links below).

My husband and I lived in Berlin, and I often walked in wonder about all the history the city had seen. There was an area where I really liked running, the East Side Gallery, which is a 1-mi piece of the Berlin Wall that is now used an open gallery for paintings. But it was not lost on me that many years ago, one couldn't even get close to the wall without risking one's life. But I had never heard about this particular trail.



The *Grenzsteintrophy* (GST) trail is the only trail in the world which faithfully follows a historic route. It's no easy ride, either, with nearly 59,000 ft of climbing (!!!) it is one of Germany's hardest mountain bike rides and apparently only a third of the cyclists who set out to ride actually finish it! Reading the article made me really think about how quickly we all forget history. I really invite you to read both articles. I even looked around on YouTube for glimpses of it from a bike stand-point (not related to the actual film from the original article, but to get a general idea of the trail itself!); it's in German but the scenery doesn't speak a language! Plus, you can hear the guy out of breath after the hills!
